




### Registered Syrian Refugees in Host Countries

66.3%

of people in need in the region are women or children

of children are out of school and a significant number of children are missing out on distance learning opportunities



In 2020, over 60%

of the households reported loss of job and entire income due to the pandemic in some countries



### Voluntary Syrian Refugee Returns as Verified by UNHCR as of 30 November 2021








Daily return average in 2021


Monthly return average in 2021 **2,995**




