






### **Durable Solutions**

30 November 2022 / Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, and Türkiye

Durable solutions for refugees from Syria are based on a comprehensive protection and solutions strategy which seeks to: 1) support host country and community resilience; 2) enable refugee self-reliance, including access to services, legal work opportunities and livelihoods; 3) expand access to resettlement in third countries and other complementary pathways, and; 4) plan for the return of refugees to Syria, on a voluntary basis, when conditions for a safe, dignified and sustainable return are in place.












# Registered Syrian Refugees in Host Countries

### **Registered Syrian Refugees in Host Countries** 5,521,790 total Registered Syrian Refugees so far in 2022 (Total includes Türkiye, Iraq, Egypt, Lebanon, Jordan, and North Africa) **Türkiye** 3,577,714 registered Syrian refugees **Iraq** 263,087 registered Syrian refugees **Egypt** 144,683 registered Syrian refugees Lebanon 825,081 registered Syrian refugees **Jordan** 669,483 registered Syrian refugees



#### **Key Facts**



**47%** of the registered Syrian refugees are children under the age of 18.



95% of Syrian refugees across the region reside within the host community, mainly in urban areas; **5%** reside in camps.



Syrian refugee youth aged between 15 and 24 years old constitute around 20% of the total registered Syrian population in the five countries.



9% of individuals were found to have a disability in Lebanon, 30% with physical or intellectual needs in Jordan, and 8% of Syrian refugees are considered to have disability in Egypt.



- \*\*\* Since the re-opening of the border on 15 October 2018, the methodology for returns data was adapted. The return data after 15 October 2018 remains tentative and is undergoing validation and readjustments.








#### **Regional Return Development**


