





Durable Solutions

Durable solutions for refugees from Syria are based on a comprehensive protection and solutions strategy which seeks to: 1) support host country and community resilience; 2) enable refugee self-reliance, including access to services, legal work opportunities and livelihoods; 3) expand access to resettlement in third countries and other complementary pathways, and; 4) plan for the return of refugees to Syria, on a voluntary basis, when conditions for a safe, dignified and sustainable return are in place.



Key Facts





48% of the registered Syrian refugees are children under the age of 18.



95% of Syrian refugees across the region reside within the host community, mainly in urban areas; 5% reside in camps.



Syrian refugee youth aged between 15 and 24 years old constitute around 20% of the total registered Syrian population in the five countries.



In Jordan, 34% of refugee families were found to have have at least one member with one or more disabilities. In Lebanon, 30% of Syrian refugee households were found to have at least one member with a disability.






Regional Return Development


